Helpful Hints to Exhibitors

Pre-Show:

1. Please read the schedule carefully (please refer to rules on the rear page for staging times and days)
2. Do not exceed any sizes stated in the schedule.
3. Make certain you have the correct number of fruits/vegetables or flowers as required.
4. Consideration given to equal size and shape of exhibits.
5. Try not to handle exhibits more than necessary, otherwise the 'bloom' is removed.
6. Do not forget to state the age, where asked for on children's entries.
7. Please mark on entry form exhibits which can be sold at auction.

Vegetables:

- Please be careful when lifting from the garden, try not to break off roots.
- Bind/Wrap the top, it makes for better presentation, i.e. onions & shallots.
- Onions look better displayed on rings (can be made from toilet roll tubes), Shallots on a plate of shallow, dry sand.
- It is better to leave roots on lettuces/cabbage – they will stay fresh longer.
- Peas / Beans should have their stalks attached.

Fruit:

- Ensure you display the correct number asked for.
- All fruit should have stalks attached.

Flowers:

- Green display vases are available at the show (evening before, and on show day). Please ensure flowers have water and are wedged with newspaper.
- Where five blooms are asked for, arrange with 3 above, 2 below or vice versa.
- Try to have blooms which are unblemished, although judges will consider weather conditions.

Pot Plants:

- To dress, remove any dead/damaged flowers and leaves – to allow plants to look their best.

It is possible that many gardeners, painters, cooks and people who are good at crafts, are perhaps shy to enter exhibits, or feel what they do is not good enough.

Don't be afraid, everyone started somewhere, and it is a bit of fun, so come on – give it a go!

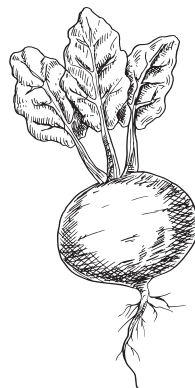

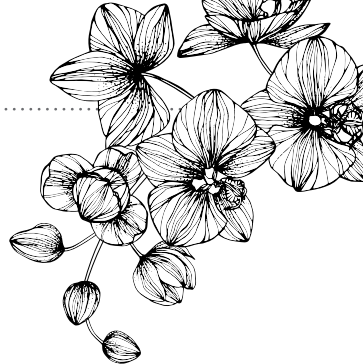

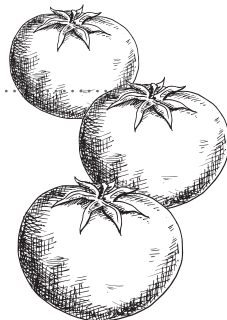

Walnut, Date & Honey Cake

RECIPE

225g Self Raising Flour	2 Eggs
1/2 tsp Ground Cinnamon	2 Medium Ripe Bananas
175g Softened Butter	100g Stoned Dates
100g Light Muscovado Sugar	50g Walnut Pieces
3 tbsp Clear Honey	

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 160C/Gas 3/Fan 140C.

Line the base and long sides of a 900g/2lb loaf tin.

Tip the flour, cinnamon, butter, sugar, 2 tablespoons of the honey and the eggs into a large mixing bowl. Mash the bananas and chop the dates and add to the bowl.

Beat the mixture for 2-3 minutes, using a wooden spoon or hand held electric mixer until well blended. Spoon into the prepared tin and level the top.

Scatter over the walnut pieces. Bake for 1 hour, then lightly press the top-it will feel firm if cooked. If not bake for a further 10 minutes.

RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

1. Classes 1-51 are for both Open & Modbury Parishoners, prizes 1-3rd will be awarded across both Modbury Parishoners (Cottagers) and those from outside the area. Trophies & Prizes will be awarded as per the list on the right hand side as in previous years which will separate Modbury Parishoners & Open competitors.
2. All exhibits must be grown by the Exhibitors, except for Floral Art classes.
3. Each exhibit must be accompanied by the entry fee of 20p,
CHILDREN ARE FREE.
4. All entries must close by **9pm on Wednesday 22nd July 2026.**
5. All exhibits must be staged between **8.00am and 10.00am on show day.**
ALL EXHIBITORS MUST LEAVE THE HALL BY 10.00AM FOR JUDGING TO COMMENCE AND NO EXHIBITS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS TIME.
Exhibits may be staged between 7-9pm on the evening prior at owner's risk
5. Vases for flowers and plates are provided by the show. Newspaper is provided to stuff the bottom of the vase & place in water.
6. Only one entry per class unless otherwise stated.
7. The judges decision to be final, and the judges may withhold prizes at their discretion.

10. **Prize money not claimed by 4pm** will benefit show funds.
